SUBJECT: Amateur Radio Operation.

TO : All Concerned.

1. To maintain and aid in training of radio operators, a temporary band of frequencies has been allotted by this headquarters for amateur operations within the theater limits by military personnel of British and United States Armed Forces.

2. Application for operation will be made to the Office of the Chief Signal Officer, AFHQ, through signal channels.

3. Application will be in letter form and will contain the following information:

a. Name of responsible commanding, signal or communications officer and name of unit.

b. Number of personnel participating.

c. Brief description of the type of equipment to be used, and provision for frequency control and stability.

d. Location of station.

e. Regulations are as follows:

g. Plain language messages in English other than official, between operators, and plain language messages in English for a third person, provided he is a member of the British or United States Armed Forces, may be handled. No military information may be passed. Messages will on no account be passed on behalf of civilians.

h. A series of four letter "X" call signs will be assigned by this headquarters on approval of application.

i. "X" call sign amateur stations may communicate only with "X" call sign amateur stations within this theater.

j. Equipment may not be requisitioned on the basis of this letter, though military radio stations on hand but not engaged in operational radio circuits may be utilized.

5. The signal, communications or commanding officer of the unit concerned will be responsible that all regulations are closely followed. Any violation will result in the station being permanently closed.

6. Provided this experiment is successful within the theater, future operations may be extended to include other countries when amateur bands are opened therein.
