- 3. Frequency control. The licensee will ensure that NO signals are radiated outside the specified bands, either by reason of frequency drift or of harmonic emission etc. Wavemeters may be obtained on loan from the nearest signal regimen:
- 4. Type of transmission. All the above bands are open to emission on A 1 (continuous wave), A 2 (modulated continuous wave), A 3 (radio telephony). The station may operate at any time, provided that no period of sending shall exceed ten consecutive minutes. A full log will be kept of all operation.
- 5. The station will only be operated by the licensee. Messages will only be exchanged with other amateur stations. The use of the station for (a) advertising or business purposes, (b) sending of news, (c) sending of broadcasting programmes, (d) sending of private messages, is prohibited. The licensee shall not receive payment (direct or indirect) for the use of the station, or allow the station to be used for social or political matters.
- 6. Inspection and control. The station will at all times be open to inspection by duly authorized officers of the Royal Corps of Signals. The licence is subject to immediate withdrawal if considered necessary by Cs R. Signals or CSO Branch BTA. The licence is only valid for British Military or Air Force personnel in the British Zone of Austria and must be returned on leaving the theatre.
